STATES

- > State Actions Addressing Business Reopenings
 - Maine
 - Order Regarding Travelers Into Maine implements Keep Maine Healthy plan
 - Allows travelers to Maine with a recent negative COVID-19 test to forgo the state's 14-day quarantine requirement and exempts New Hampshire (NH) and Vermont (VT) residents from the travel requirement, effective immediately; provides that NH and VT residents may stay in lodging establishments beginning June 12, 2020
 - Travelers to Maine who are not residents of NH or VT will be asked to produce a <u>Certificate of Compliance</u> at lodging check-in indicating that they have either received a negative COVID-19 test result, will quarantine in Maine for 14 days, or have completed their quarantine in Maine, effective July 1, 2020
