 Describe your firm's approach to litigation and your strategy for building successful teams for trials or other matters. Discuss the two biggest litigation cases your firm worked on in 2020 and how you reached successful outcomes. The two biggest litigations we worked on in 2020 were for Rite Aid and ITT. For Rite Aid we reached a successful outcome by bringing an early dispositive motion keyed to what the client needs. For ITT, we reached a successful outcome through trial ability, employing fact and expert testimony in a tightly presented and carefully orchestrated series of trials.

• What are the most challenging and satisfying aspects of your work in litigation? The most challenging aspects of litigation in the COVID era involves



engaging in delicate settlement negotiations remotely. It is most gratifying when parties reach a mutually agreeable complex settlement and leave the negotiations as friendly colleagues.

■ What is the most important piece of advice you'd share with young lawyers? All litigation aspects must have a strategic focus, determined by the client, with good advice, including settlements. Never lose sight of long-term strategic goals. Disregard opposing counsel's words and deeds.
