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141 Law Firms Honored For LGBTQ+ Equality

Law360 (January 27, 2022, 4:35 PM EST) -- The number of U.S. law firms receiving a perfect score for LGBTQ+ equality has increased since a report last year, indicating that the legal industry has further advanced workplace protections.

The findings were in the Human Rights Campaign Foundation's annual Corporate Equality Index, or CEI, a benchmarking survey and report on policies, practices and benefits pertinent to LGBTQ+ employees, released Thursday.

A record 842 businesses earned the CEI's top score of 100, including 141 law firms, that have been designated a Best Place to Work for LGBTQ+ Equality. Last year, 135 law firms received the honor.

All together, 166 law firms were ranked on the CEI Index this year.

Hinshaw & Culbertson LLP achieved a 100% rating for the 13th consecutive year.

"The CEI has had an incredible impact on the business world since its inception," Hinshaw & Culbertson Chairman Peter Sullivan said in a statement. "I'm thrilled that Hinshaw continues to lead the way with other 'Best Places to Work' firms in advancing the cause of workplace equality."

Greenberg Traurig LLP earned a 100% score for the sixth year in a row.

"We are immensely proud of maintaining our 100% score on the CEI and of being named one of the Best Places to Work for LGBTQ+ Equality, not only in the United States, but also in Mexico," Greenberg Traurig CEO Brian L. Duffy said in a statement. "We live our diversity; it is part of who we are as a firm, and we look forward to further growing our initiatives that help strengthen protections for the LGBTQ+ community."

In addition to the law firms, 1,271 major U.S. businesses were ranked on the CEI, the most to be ranked by the Human Rights Campaign Foundation in the index's 20-year history.

"When the Human Rights Campaign Foundation created the Corporate Equality Index 20 years ago, we dreamed that LGBTQ+ workers — from the factory floor to corporate headquarters, in big cities and small towns — could have access to the policies and benefits needed to thrive and live life authentically," Jay Brown, the senior vice president of programs, research and training for the Human Rights Campaign, said in a statement. "We are proud that the Corporate Equality Index paved the way to that reality for countless LGBTQ+ workers in America and abroad."

This year's CEI criteria were expanded to include gender-affirming health care and workplace policies, including a new category on family formation to ensure equitable access to family benefits for sameand different-gender legal spouses and domestic partners.
