



- National Climate Task Force
- Interagency Working Group on Coal and Power Plant Communities and Economic Revitalization
- White House Environmental Justice Interagency Council



Implementing the "All of Government" Approach





Executive Order on Climate

- Paris Agreement
- Office of Domestic Climate Policy + National Climate Task Force
- Procure low-carbon energy & vehicles
- Pause oil & gas leases and eliminate subsidies
- Land conservation
- Assist affected communities



Legislative Goals: American Jobs Plan

- Clean Electricity Standard
- Electrical grid + public transit improvements
- Electric vehicle incentives + infrastructure
- Carbon reduction + climate resiliance technology
- Civilian Climate Corps



Budget Proposal

- \$10 billion for clean energy research
- \$1 billion for Advanced Research Projects Agency-Climate
- \$600 million for electric vehicles and charging infrastructure
- \$550 million to remediate oil and gas wells and coal mines



Department of Interior

- Facilitating renewable leasing
- Halting new oil & gas leasing and disincentivizing fossil fuel development



Department of Agriculture

- Financial incentives for GHG-reducing practices
- Conservation programs

Clean energy research and development




Department of Defense




- Aggressive stationary source regulations
