Corporate Practice

Corporate Practice prohibits corporate entities from practicing a licensed profession (including medicine, dentistry, physical therapy, among others).



Licensing and Enrollment

A transaction may constitute a "change of ownership," requiring consent from a government agency to transfer an enrollment, license, or permit.



Fraud and Abuse


Fraud and abuse laws, including the federal anti-kickback statute and the Stark Law, should be considered when structuring a transaction.

Owning or Operating Certain Businesses


- Holding equity in a professional practice

Licensing and Enrollment

- Businesses in the healthcare industry hold various permits, licenses, and enrollments.
- A transaction may constitute a "change of ownership" (CHOW) that requires consent from a government agency in order to transfer an applicable permit, license, or enrollment.
- The government consent process is burdensome and time-consuming.
 Alternative transaction structures can be considered to avoid a CHOW.






